SECTION 2: HAZARD IDENTIFICATION

WARNING

Harmful if inhaled. Avoid breathing spray mist. Moderately irritating to eyes. Avoid contact with eyes or clothing.

Potential Health Effects:

EYE: May cause slight eye irritation.

SKIN: May cause slight skin irritation.

CHRONIC: Chronic feeding studies in mice and rats indicated no treatment related effects or evidence of carcinogenicity. Glyphosate does not cause embryotoxicity, fetotoxicity, infertility, or mutagenic effects.

Potential Physical Hazards: Can decompose at high temperatures forming irritating and toxic gases. Reacts with galvanized steel or unlined mild steel to produce hydrogen, a highly flammable gas.

Environmental Hazards: Slightly to practically non-toxic to birds, fish, aquatic invertebrates, and bees. Toxic to non-target terrestrial and aquatic plant species. Keep out of waterways.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

FIRST AID

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

SPILLS OR LEAKS: Wear protective clothing as described in Section 8 of this SDS. Absorb liquid with material such as clay, sand, sawdust, or dirt. Sweep up and place in a suitable container for disposal and label the contents. Area can be washed down with a suitable solution of bleach or soda ash and an appropriate alcohol (methanol, ethanol, or isopropanol). Follow this by washing with a strong soap and water solution. Absorb any excess liquid as indicated above, and add to the disposal container. Keep product, contaminated materials and wash water out of streams and sewers. Wash exposed body areas thoroughly after handling.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

Keep out of reach of children. Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

HANDLING: Wear proper safety equipment specified in Section 8 when mixing, loading or otherwise handling this product. Spray solutions of this product should be mixed, stored and applied using only stainless steel, aluminum, fiberglass, plastic or plastic-lined steel containers.

DO NOT MIX, STORE OR APPLY THIS PRODUCT OR SPRAY SOLUTIONS OF THIS PRODUCT IN GALVANIZED STEEL OR UNLINED STEEL (EXCEPT STAINLESS STEEL) CONTAINERS OR SPRAY TANKS. This product or spray solutions of this product react with such containers and tanks to produce hydrogen gas which may form a highly combustible gas mixture. This gas mixture could flash or explode, causing serious personal injury, if ignited by open flame, spark, welder's torch, lighted cigarette or other ignition source.



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STORAGE: Keep container closed to prevent spills and contamination. Keep in original containers, tightly closed, and out of reach of children and animals. Keep away from food, feedstuff and water supplies. Containers should be stored in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area and away from heat. Do not allow product to freeze. Compatible storage materials include stainless steel, aluminum, fiberglass, plastic, and glass lined containers. Incompatible storage materials include galvanized steel and unlined mild steel.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

Applicators and other handlers must wear: long-sleeved shirt and long pants, shoes plus socks, and protective eyewear.

Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables exist, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry.

User Safety Recommendations

Users should:

- Wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet.
- Remove clothing immediately if pesticide gets inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing.

Domestic Animals: This product is considered to be relatively non-toxic to dogs and other domestic animals; however, ingestion of this product or large amounts of freshly sprayed vegetation may result in temporary gastrointestinal irritation (vomiting, diarrhea, colic, etc.). If such symptoms are observed, provide the animal with plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration. Call a veterinarian if symptoms persist for more than 24 hours.

STABILITY: Stable, however may decompose if heated.

CHEMICAL CONDITIONS TO AVOID: Avoid excessive heat and fire.

SECTION 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

ACUTE TOXICITY:

ORAL (rat): The oral LD50 is 5,000 mg/kg.

DERMAL (rabbit): The dermal LD50 is > 5,000mg/kg.

INHALATION (rat): The inhalation LC50 (4 hrs.) is 2.6 mg/L.

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SECTION 12: ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION

ENVIRONMENTAL SUMMARY: Do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water when cleaning equipment or disposing of equipment washwaters or rinseate.

ENVIRONMENTAL FATE: Glyphosate is considered to be non-persistent in soils with a median half-life ranging from 1.85 to 2.06 days. It is strongly absorbed to soils and does not pose a threat to groundwater contamination. Studies indicate that glyphosate has a very low potential for bioaccumulation.

SECTION 13: DISPOSAL CONSIDERATIONS

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage and disposal.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Wastes resulting from the use of this product that cannot be used or chemically reprocessed should be disposed of in a landfill approved for pesticide disposal or in accordance with applicable Federal, state, or local procedures. Emptied container retains vapor and product residue. Observe all labeled safeguards until container is cleaned, reconditioned, or destroyed.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Non-refillable containers. Do not reuse or refill this container. Triple rinse or pressure rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Offer for recycling or reconditioning, if appropriate, or dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration, or if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

Non-refillable container less than or equal to 5 gallons: Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container 1/4 full with water and recap. Shake for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat this procedure two more times.

Non-refillable container greater than 5 gallons: Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container 1/4 full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip back and forth several times. Turn the container over on its other end and tip back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times.

Pressure rinse as follows (all sizes): Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and continue to drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Hold container upside down over application equipment or mix tank or collect rinsate for later use or disposal. Insert pressure rinsing nozzle in the side of the container and rinse at about 40 PSI for at least 30 seconds. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip.

Refillable container (250 gallon & Bulk): Refill this container with pesticide only. Do not reuse this container for any other purpose. Cleaning the container before final disposal is the



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responsibility of the person disposing of the container. Cleaning before refilling is the responsibility of the refiller.

To clean the container before final disposal, empty the remaining contents from the container into application equipment or mix tank. Fill the container about 10 percent full with water. Agitate vigorously or recirculate water with pump for 2 minutes. Pour or pump rinsate into application equipment or rinsate collection system. Repeat this rinsing process two more times.
