Aerial Application Instructions for Use on Almonds and Walnuts

This supplemental label expires August 10, 2020 and must not be used or distributed after this date.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Apply ReTain with fixed wing or helicopter. Applications by air need to be done using a minimum of 15 gallons per acre to ensure thorough coverage. Do not apply ReTain when the risk of excessive drift is expected due to temperature inversion, wind patterns and humidity. To prevent drift into neighboring crops and bodies of water: Consider the direction of the wind in relation to the spraying pattern that the aircraft will have to follow to make the application. Do not apply if wind direction can push droplets towards other crops and bodies of water. Do not apply when wind speeds are greater than 10 mph and consider droplet size. Smaller droplets, which include smaller than 200 microns, are more likely to cause drift. Consider a larger size droplet that also provides good coverage on the crop canopy. Nozzle orientation and boom size must be based on the wing span and type of aircraft (e.g. fixed wing vs rotary wing) to consider air streams, vortices and lift properties of the aircraft
