#### **ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS**

#### **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

This supplemental label and the federally registered label must be in the possession of the user at the time of pesticide application. Follow all applicable directions, restrictions, Worker Protection Standard requirements, and precautions on this supplemental label and the main EPA registered label.

Spray volume: Apply in a minimum finished spray volume of 20 gallons per acre by ground and 10 gallons per acre by air. To achieve optimum pest control, it is important to obtain thorough and uniform spray coverage.

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#### **RESTRICTIONS:**

Do not cut current year's treated alfalfa seed crop for hay or forage. Do not graze current year's treated alfalfa seed crop. Treated alfalfa seed is not to be used for sprouting.

- 1) For purposes of pesticide registration in the State of Arizona, all alfalfa seed crop fields are considered non-food and non-feed sites of pesticide use provided that the following conditions are met.
  - a) All seed screenings shall be disposed of in such a way that they cannot be distributed or used for food or feed. The seed conditioner shall keep records of screening disposal for three years from the date of disposal and shall furnish the records to the State forthwith upon request. Disposal records shall consist of documentation from a controlled dumpsite, incinerator or other equivalent disposal site and shall show the amount of material disposed of, its grower and the date of disposal.
  - b) No portion of the seed alfalfa plant including, but not limited to, green chop, hay, pellets, meal, whole seed, cracked seed and seed screenings may be used or distributed for food or feed purposes.
  - c) All alfalfa seed grown or conditioned as a non-food or non-feed site in the State of Arizona shall bear a tag or distinctively show on the container label the statement "Not for Human or Animal Consumption".
  - d) No alfalfa seed grown or conditioned as a non-food or non-feed site in the State of Arizona may be distributed for human consumption or animal feed.
- 2) A violation of any condition listed in subsection (1) above is declared a violation of the use directions contained in this label and is prohibited.

Refer to the EPA registered label for information on chemigation.

### **RESISTANCE MANAGEMENT:**

Acetamiprid is the active ingredient in ASSAIL® 70WP Insecticide. It is a member of a class of chemicals known as neonicotinoids. Rotating ASSAIL® 70WP Insecticide with pesticides with different modes of action may delay or prevent development of insecticide resistance. The use of ASSAIL® 70WP Insecticide should conform to resistance management strategies established for the use area. Consult your agricultural advisor, university contact or extension service for recommended pest management practices for your area. Use recommended integrated pest management practices so that you are not relying solely on chemical control in your crop production.
