4. First Aid Measures

Eye : Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15 to 20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Skin : Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15 to 20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

Inhalation : Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably by mouth-to-mouth, if possible. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.

Ingestion : Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by the poison control center or doctor. Do not give any liquid to the person. Do not give anything by mouth if unconscious or convulsing.

Indication of Immediate Medical Attention and Special Treatment Needed : Aspiration hazard if swallowed. Can enter lungs and cause damage. Treat symptomatically. Contact poison treatment specialist immediately if large quantities have been ingested or inhaled.



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5. Fire Fighting Measures

- Extinguishing Media** : Use water fog, foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide extinguishing agents. Do not use straight streams of water.
