2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION SUMMARY

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

STEPS TO BE TAKEN IF MATERIAL IS RELEASED OR SPILLED:

Control the spill at its source. Contain spill to prevent spreading or contamination of soil and absorb with suitable absorbent, sweep up material and transfer to containers for possible land application according to label use or for proper disposal. Wash spill area with water containing strong detergent, absorb and sweep up as above. Check local, state and federal regulations for proper disposal. Use a NIOSH approved respirator with any N, R, P or HE filter in case of emergency spills.

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7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

HANDLING: Wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet. Remove clothing immediately if pesticide

gets inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing. Remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the

outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash thoroughly and change into clean clothing.

STORAGE: Store in a well-ventilated, secure area out of reach of children and domestic animals. Store in original container only.
